EVERGREEN TREES DESCRIPTIONS

Red Pine: Most versatile conifer for Marquette County. Rapid growing tree, can get over 35 feet tall. Has long green needles and will grow in sandy soils, prefers full sun.

White Pine: Grows over 35 feet tall. Best looking of pines when mature. Prefers moist sandy loam soil. Has long, soft green needles.

Black Hill Spruce: Grows over 35 feet tall and has short, stiff, dark green needles. Extremely hardy; withstanding wide range of soil types and is drought resistant. Also has a spicy scent.

 **Balsam Fir:** We are bringing back this year the tree that is known as the traditional Christmas tree. Excellent fragrance with good needle retention. Prefers well drained, moist soil. Full to partial sun.

Blue Spruce: Grows over 35 feet tall and has short, bluish-green needles. Most adaptable of the spruces. Prefers rich moist soil in full sun, but can handle drier, well-drained sites and some shade. Subject to severe needle fungus diseases.

White Spruce: Moderate growing tree with bluish-green needles, and short, dense branches. A popular Christmas tree, as well as an ornamental & windbreak tree. Endures drought conditions well.

White Cedar: Fan-like glossy scale like leaves provide year-round color. Forms a wind tight barrier when used for screening or as hedging. Foliage turns bronze during autumn in the north. Prefers heavy damp areas.

LANDSCAPING TREES

Blue Spruce-LARGE: These are a 4 year old transplant that comes in bundles of 5 due to their large size. These are more for the yard or landscaping purposes. Has bluish-green, short, dense needles. Thrives well in dry, well-drained soils.

Norway Spruce-LARGE: These are also a 4 year old transplant that comes in bundles of 5 due to their large size. These are more for the yard or landscaping purposes. It has short, dark green needles. Fastest growing Spruce, does well in moist soils.

DECIDUOUS TREES & SHRUBS DESCRIPTIONS

Hybrid Poplar: Grows approximately 50 feet tall and spreads 30 feet. A fast growing tree with large leaves giving lots of shade in a hurry. Soil adaptable.

Red Osier Dogwood: This shrub grows 7-9 feet tall and spreads 8-12 feet. Prefers wet to medium dry soils. Dark red branches with white flowers followed by white berries. Good for soil erosion and food and cover for wildlife.

High Bush Cranberry: This attractive shrub has foliage that turns red and orange in the fall. Flat clusters of white flowers followed by red berries. Grows 8 feet tall.

White Birch: Grows up to 70 feet tall. White bark and is Birch-borer resistant. Prefers moist, well-drained soil, full sun.

Tamarack: Grows 50-75 feet tall. Does well in wet, poorly drained areas. In the summer it has short, soft needles and tiny cones. It is an unusual conifer tree that loses its needles in the winter.

Hazelnut: This small shrub is often in clumps reaching 12 feet in height. Edible brown nuts. Grows best in moist, well-drained soils but will adapt to most types of soils. Full sun or deep shade. Attracts wildlife such as deer, grouse, turkeys, pheasants & quail.

White Oak: Hardy deciduous shade tree. Majestic rounded shape. Dark green leaves, typical oak leaf shape that turns bronze in the fall. Slow growing, extremely long lived (300 yrs. or more). Grows 100 feet or higher.

Red Maple: Grows 80-100 feet tall. Medium to fast growing tree. Small red flowers in early spring. This is the "Acer Rubrum" species that produces brilliant red fall foliage. Tolerates most soil types. Exceptional shade and ornamental wildlife habitat.

 **Juneberry:** This shrub grows to 6-20 feet tall. Small to medium sized shrub that bears beautiful white flowers followed by a bright red berry in June and July. Great shrub for wildlife.

Sugar Maple: Grows to 100 feet tall. This is an outstanding native shade tree. Dark green leaves turn to yellow to orange to fiery red in the fall. Grows in most soil types. Sap used for maple sugar. Used for ornamental, lumber & wildlife habitat.
